Both Ray & his wife Pearl (Cissy) wished to be bogether after they died, as they had been for the last 22 years of their lives. However, when Pearl Cecily Eugenia died in 1954, she was cremated and placed in permanent storage at Cypress View because Ray was too bereaved and drunk to make final arrangements.

For 57 years Cissy & Ray have been waiting to be reunited.

Due to the efforts of Aissa Wayne, Esq., Patrick DeCarolis, Esq., and Dr. Annie Thiel-Latker, Loren Latker was able to get a court order from Judge Richard S. Whitney, allowing for the removal of Cissy's cremains and interment with Ray.

Today, Valentine's Day, they are finally reunited.
